Application Experience - Horizon2020 MSCA

❑ EUROPAH (ITN-ETN-2016, submitted 3 times, ~€4M)

2014 (86.8%), 2015 (90%), 2016 (93.6%)

❑ PIONEER (ITN-EJD-2018, submitted 2 times, ~€4M)

2017 (91.2%, reserved list), 2018 (95.8%)

❑ BIOMASS-CCU (RISE-2018, submitted 1 time, ~€860k)

2018 (85.4%)

Resubmission of the proposal – addressing the negative comments of all reviewers and revising the proposal – improving the quality of the proposal!



Application Experience - Horizon Europe (Pillar II)

❑ ColdSpark (RIA, CL5-2021, ~€3M)

Coordinator (Industry)

7 partners, score 14.5 (Excellence 4.5, Impact 5, Implementation 5)

❑ DARE2X (RIA, CL5-2021, ~€3M) success after 1 resubmission

(resubmit to a different call)

Coordinator (RTO), 6 partners, score 15 (in 2022)

First submission (RIA, CL4-2021, ~€5M): 10 partners, score 12.5

(Excellence 3.5, Impact 4.5, Implementation 4.5)

Resubmission of the proposal – Possible but more challenging!

You need to find another suitable call; You might need to reorganise the consortium and/or change the topic.

Difference Between Pillar I and Pillar II



- ❑ Excellent Science (Scientific challenges) vs Technology (scale-up, development, demonstration, etc) - Example
- ❑ Open topic vs specified topic (specific call requirements)
- ❑ Low TRL vs High TRL (clear starting/target TRL, RIA and IA)
- ❑ Requirements of KPIs
- ❑ Training programmes (including (joint) supervision)
- ❑ Exploitation (business plan, regulations/policy influence)
- ❑ Role of industrial partners / Expertise of partners
- ❑ Expected impact/outcomes

Common Aspects of Pillar 1 and Pillar 2



- Innovative aspects & clear and well-defined objectives
- Open science and data management
- Gender dimension
- Methodology
- Interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary nature
- Dissemination and communication strategy
- Implementation (structure)



Resubmit a Pillar I proposal to a Pillar II call (or vice versa)?

- The concepts developed in the Pillar I proposal (or outcomes of the Pillar I grants) could be used for the Pillar II application
- Your existing network is valuable
- You might need to reorganise the consortium
- Think about the difference between Pillar I and Pillar II
